#### **Advancement of RCR Leaders in the MENA**

From the time of the launch of the "Research Ethics Program in Jordan" in 2015 till now; the program has been able to graduate 3 cohorts of fellows and leaders in the field of Research Ethics, for a total of 70 fellows. Starting Year two of the program, the program began to spread to the Middle East and North Africa (known as the MENA) region; as we accepted fellows from many different countries such as Yemen, Iraq, Morocco, Sudan, Algeria, Tunisia, Egypt, Mauritania, Lebanon, Libya and from the Gaza Strip.

These graduate fellows have managed to serve as members on IRB Committees in their country of residence, served as mentors for past and present fellows of our program, presented talks at conferences and they have also trained many graduate and undergraduate students in their institutes, by holding workshops on different aspects of research ethics, as well as assume administrative positions.

This year we have accepted our last batch of fellows, as we are hoping to graduate at least an additional 40 fellows bringing the total number of fellow graduates from the program to about 110, the targeted number of phase one of the program.

#### Train the trainer-Workshops conducted by the program fellows

# As of this year the program has proudly trained a total of 564 trainees in Research Ethics & Responsible Conduct of Research.

As part of their Summer Practicum Project requirements a number of our fellows held workshops on research ethics and responsible conduct of research; the workshop attendees came from many different backgrounds; they were either fellow faculty members or graduate/undergraduate students at their institutes.

- Workshop Year 1 of the program (12 Trainees): A one day Research Ethics Workshop: Issues
  in Research Misconduct; Authorship and Publication and Data Management. The attendees
  were faculty members from both Applied Medical Sciences and Nursing at Jordan University of
  Science and Technology (JUST). The workshop was conducted by Dr. Hanan Khalil, Faculty
  of Applied Medical Sciences, and Dr. Nihaya Al-Sheyab, Faculty of Nursing, Jordan University of Science and Technology
- Workshop Year 2 of the program (45 Trainees): This workshop was held over two days; the attendees were members of the school of Pharmacy (graduate and faculty members), Mansoura University in Egypt. The workshop aimed at establishing knowledge and raised awareness of the attendants towards the basic modules of RCR that every researcher should know. The subjects of research misconduct (fabrication, falsification and plagiarism), conflict of interest and whistleblowing, authorship, mentoring, the first day. While the subjects of research involving human subjects, using animal subjects in research and data management were discussed in the second day. The workshop was conducted by: our RCR fellow, Dr. Amal Sallam, Faculty of Pharmacy, Mansoura University, Mansoura, Egypt.
- Workshops Year 3 of the program (207 Total Trainees): Four of the program fellows held workshops that targeted different aspects of Research Ethics and Responsible Conduct of Research:
  - Dr. Alaa Abou-Alfetouh-Faculty of Pharmacy, Alexandria University, Egypt: She held a 2-day workshop on Awareness of RCR among researchers at the School of Pharmacy-Alexandria University- Egypt. Subjects addressed were Authorship, research misconduct, conflict of Interest, and informed consent. There was a total of 60 trainees on both days.
  - 2. Dr. Nidal Eshah- Faculty of Nursing Zarqa University-Jordan: He held a one-day workshop on: Ethical responsibilities in scientific writing: authorship, mentoring and plagiarism. There was a total of 15 trainees.
  - 3. Dr. Fadwa Alhalaiqa Faculty of Nursing-Philadelphia University-Jordan. She held a 2-day workshop at her university that addressed ethical issues in research such as informed consent, data protection, estimating risk, bias and confounding; research misconduct, whistle-blowing, publication, authorship, and peer review. There was a total of 35 trainees.
  - 4. Dr. Fadia Mayyas- Faculty of Pharmacy –Jordan University of Science & Technology (JUST). She held a one-day Workshop: Awareness and Knowledge of Manuscript Structure

On Tuesday Nov. 7th, 2017, his Majesty King Abdullah II patronized the inauguration of the World Science Forum 2017, which kicked off at the King Hussein Bin Talal Convention Center on the Dead Sea shores. ## Translation of Resources for Research Ethics Education into Arabic

In the past four years and as part of their requirements for a Summer Practicum Project many of the program fellows were able to translate material and papers into the Arabic language or develop a research ethics module in Arabic. ### The Loss of a Rising Star: Remembring Dr. Abeer Qandil

It was with great sadness and sorrow that our RCR Training Program in Jordan lost to cancer one of its rising stars Dr. Abeer Qandil. As the fellows worked with each other and with the mentors and directors, a family-like relationship and appreciation developed and losing Dr. Qandil was like losing a member of my extended family. She confided to me about her cancer when I was enquiring as her mentor why her practicum report, the last part of completing the fellowship, was not delivered by the deadline. When I learned she was in treatment for cancer I asked her to focus on her health and treatment and gave her a one-year extension to graduate with the fellows in the following year. She was emailing me from her bed in the hospital so concerned about how she will complete her practicum. The severe illness she was being treated for did not undermine her commitment to research ethics. She got a little better and was able to complete her practicum in the following months and delivered the full report and passed despite her illness and chemo-treatment. At the time of her graduation, she was too ill to come to the ceremony, and her son came to receive it on her behalf. Despite knowing her disease has become terminal and she had little time left in her life she was focused on graduating and receiving the certificate of graduation. She passed away on October 26th, 2017, just two weeks after the graduation ceremony. Writing about it brings tears to my eyes on how someone was knowing they are leaving this life and are ill yet so committed to graduation from this Fogarty International Center Research Ethics Program Fellowship. In my opinion, this is the ultimate ethical example of the values that responsible conduct of research stands for. She will always be remembered as a hero of our program and a role model for all of us to follow.
